Rev. Carol Borland from West Glover, VT. Rev. Borland will be using a portion of the Fellowship to begin a support/educational group for people like herself with Parkinson's disease in the northern part of Vermont, where she served most of her ministry. With the remaining funds, she and her husband, Kenneth, plan a trip to Scotland including a cycle tour of Hadrian's wall.
